“Super Me” Flies Into Douglasville

Douglasville, Georgia – on Saturday, March 25th at 4pm, Story Ship Theatre will bring its multi-disciplinary theatre program, “Super Me” to Douglasville at Brighten Academy for a free family show. Hosted indoors, the show runs 40-50 minutes and while pitched towards K-5 grades. The hip hop music, interactive dancing and message of anti-bullying provides valuable entertainment for all ages.

“Super Me” is presented by the Cultural Arts Council Douglasville/Douglas County as part of its “Family ArtsVentures!” program that brings curricula-based programs into the schools, followed by a free public performance for families. In the week before the public show, “Super Me” will have been performed at Sweetwater, Mt. Carmel, Eastside and Holly Springs Elementary Schools.

Story Ship is an arts-education company based in Savannah that, over 25 years has performed over 5,000 shows throughout the country with STEAM programs that incorporate curricula, technology and interactive activities to animate the learning process. Shows feature the traditional (magic and puppets) to the cutting edge (3-D animation and holograms). Last year CAC brought Story Ship to Bright Star Elementary with the “Diggery Dino” show about archeology and with the “Pirate Goodie” show at O’Neal Plaza.

“Super Me” is a theatrical experience in which the audience enters a cartoon world and helps a young boy discover his own unique super powers so he can avoid bullies.

Funding for the “Family ArtsVentures!” program is provided by the Georgia Council on the Arts and the GreyStone Power Foundation.

Youngsters are encouraged to wear their super capes to the show and the Cultural Arts Council hopes to have a local version of the “Legion of Super Heroes” in attendance, Brighten Academy is located at 5897 Priestley Mill Road and the performance is in the gym. Ample parking is available for this free performance.
