The CAC kick's off it's first Tiny Fundraiser, featuring 6x6in original artworks made and donated by artists, designers, college students, youths, and YOU! Each artwork must be 6x6 square inches (15cm) or mounted on a 6x6 board, signed only on the back, and exhibited anonymously. All entries will be accepted; exhibited in the gallery, and offered for sale to the public for \$20 each to benefit the CAC. Artists names will be revealed to the buyer upon purchase and all artworks will remain on display through August 28, 2017. Artists' names will be revealed online after the show on August 28. Artists may enter up to 4 artworks of any medium (2D or 3D) and there is no fee to enter.

Purchasing in the Gallery

It is recommended that visitors who wish to purchase attend the opening reception, August 3 at 6pm, as any "tiny" artwork may be purchased for \$20 in a first come, first serve basis. When a work is purchased, the buyer will receive a receipt revealing the artists's name. The artwork will be marked as sold and will remain on display for the remainder of the exhibition.

A Tiny Fundraiser: Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What are the goals of *A Tiny Fundraiser*?

A. We hope to have significant participation from many artists and community members as we strive to exhibit and sell artworks from around the county. Help us make *A Tiny Fundraiser* an amazing expression of support for artists, arts institutions, creativity, and participation! The money raised through this fundraiser will help fund the thoughtful programming we provide to the wonderful community of Douglasville & Douglas County throughout the year.

Q. How do I enter my artwork?

A. Complete the OFFICE and BUYER sections of the entry form for each individual artwork and mail or deliver your artwork, along with the registration form, by the due deadline. Artwork Entry Forms may be downloaded here: www.ArtsDouglas.org/CACTinyFundraiser **THERE IS NO FEE TO ENTER.**

Q. Do I need an art background to enter?

A. No. We encourage people of all ages and skill level to participate.

Q. Can I enter more than one piece?

A. *Of course.* The goal is to gather many pieces of original 6-by-6 works of art. **Each person may enter up to 4 artworks.**

Q. Can I enter a series?

A. Of course. We cannot guarantee that the complete series will be installed together or in order, but we will try to install them in a horizontal row. We cannot accommodate vertical sequencing. **Each person may enter up to four artworks.** If you want them in a certain order, please number the works left to right.

Q. I am a teacher and I would like to have my elementary, middle, or high school class enter artworks.

A. We love having student participation in *A Tiny Fundraiser!* Have all your students make 6-by-6 artworks, then choose four artworks from each class (based on your own criteria) to be entered in *A Tiny Fundraiser.*

Q. Can my piece be 3D (three dimensional)?

A. Yes. 6 by 6 by 6 inches. Please keep in mind that in order to install this exhibition our highly skilled staff will only be using push pins, small nails, or hooks on a grid. If your piece is smaller than 6 inches, please mount it to a 6 by 6 inch board or support.

Q. What mediums can I use?

A. We encourage all types of mediums you are able to use, including but not limited to paints, printmaking, photography, metals, fabrics, etc. Due to the size restrictions, all materials must remain under a 6x6x6in frame/canvas - no loose or hanging materials please, as these will obscure other artworks nearby. Please keep in mind the weight of the final product, as all work will either be pinned or hung by a small nail/hook. If your artwork (or support board) is thicker than 1/4 inches, please string to hang.

Q. Can I enter a canvas?

A. Of course. 6-by-6 canvases are accepted as long as they are **pre-wired.**

Q. Does 6x6 inches include a border or mat? Can my piece be smaller than 6 inches square?

A. The external dimensions of the piece should be exactly 6 inches square including border and mat. Smaller pieces may be mounted to 6" x 6" paper or board. Installation is based on a grid, artworks larger than 6" x 6" affect the efficiency of this method.

Q. I want to frame my pieces. If I supply the hanging materials, can I enter these works?

A. Due to the small size restriction, framing is not recommended. If you do decide to frame your pieces, please make sure it is wired and ready to hang because we have many artworks to install, we cannot spend time on wiring work.

Q. Which artworks are already sold? Is there a way that I can shop online for only the available artworks?

A. Artworks that are sold are marked with a colored dot in the gallery; unfortunately, you will not be able to shop online.

Q. How will the work be installed?

A. The work will be installed in a grid pattern in the order in which it is received.

Q. Can I build a video installation?

A. We're sorry; we cannot accommodate a video installation at this time.

Q. May I cut a 6-by-6 hole out of the gallery wall as my artwork?

A. No - but good try though.

Q. If my piece does not sell during the exhibition will I get it back?

A. No. Any works not sold by August 25, 2017 will remain at the CAC, and may be posted for sale online. We reserve the right to sell works for less than \$20.

Q. Will all artworks be displayed?

A. We will do everything in our power to display all artwork submitted. SEND YOUR ARTWORKS EARLY!

Q. Are any artworks rejected?

A. The Cultural Arts Council Douglasville | Douglas County reserves the right to reject any artwork. However, after many years and numerous exhibits we have rarely rejected artworks, if any.

Q. What other restrictions are there for the artworks?

A. Please DO NOT enter any works containing **glitter** or **unfixed charcoal or pastels** - it can spread to other works.

Q. Where does the money from the sale of an artwork go?

A. All proceeds benefit the Cultural Arts Council of Douglasville | Douglas County. This is a fun initiative that brings together a diverse group of people. It is also an important fundraiser that enables thoughtful art programming.

Q. Will the artists find out who purchased their artwork?

A. Not from the Cultural Arts Council Douglasville | Douglas County. The buyer receives a Buyer Receipt ("Buyer" portion of the entry form) with the artist's name and contact information. The buyer may then contact the artist if they would like to. When entering artworks, be sure to put some form of contact information (ex. a business card) if you wish to be contacted by the buyer of your artwork.

Q: If my artwork sells, do I still retain copyright?

A: Yes, the copyright belongs to the artist upon creation and remains as such regardless of the buyer. It is important to include contact information with your piece so that the buyer can contact you.

Q. When can I begin purchasing works from *A Tiny Fundraiser*?

A. The gallery exhibition will open for preview on Thursday, August 3rd. Sales will begin August 3 at 6:00pm as we kick off the opening reception. Buying will then be open to all after the opening reception during our regular business hours. Purchasing will be on a first-come, first-served basis; we cannot hold an artwork for future payment.

Q. What forms of payment will you accept?

A. We will accept cash, checks, and major credit cards. Please see CAC representative for assistance with your purchase.

Q. How do I retrieve artwork I purchase from *A Tiny Fundraiser*?

A. Artworks from *A Tiny Fundraiser* will remain on display until August 25, 2017. **Artwork Pick-Up days are: August 28 - 30, 10am-5pm.** If you are unable to pick up your purchased works on these days, please pay our flat shipping fee of \$10 to have the work mailed to you AFTER the close of the exhibition. Artworks will be shipped via USPS.

Q. I can't make it to the Pick-Up days. How will I obtain the pieces that I purchased?

A. When you buy any piece for \$20 you have the option of paying an extra \$10 to have the work(s) mailed to you AFTER the close of the exhibition on August 28, 2017. *If you can't make it to the pick-up days, you must have the work shipped to you.*

Q. Admission to the exhibition?

A. Admission for the exhibition is absolutely FREE. General admission to the opening reception on August 3, 2017 from 6-8pm is also FREE to the general public! The exhibit is open Monday through Friday, from 9am until 5pm, August 3-25 alongside the "What's on Your Walls?" exhibit.
